Thoughts from a Deacon

Thoughts From a Deacon 12/02/23

Jesus said, "...that day and hour no one knows, neither the angels of heaven, not the Son, but only the Father. Beware, keep alert;.......And what I say to you I say to all: Keep awake." (from our Gospel according to Mark)

We cannot be ready or prepared for the birth of Christ; that's in the past. But we can prepare and wait for the future, for Christ's return. When? Where? We don't know and it doesn't matter. It's God's time, not ours. How do we get ready to wait?

It's hard enough to prepare for something we know is coming. Thanksgiving just passed and Christmas

is a few weeks away. Every year they come at the same time, and even with the media world pushing us to get ready earlier and earlier, we still find ourselves running around and wishing we had more time for ourselves. But, again, it's God's time.

Let's say we know the date and it's December 25, 2023. What would you do in these few weeks? Forgive everyone, ask for forgiveness, pray more, give more? Would you re-organize, relook at your values, serve the least of these, let relationships grow? Would you now live your life the way God wants you



to? Father Jim said, "What are we looking forward to? Our goal is to be vigilant about our spiritual life as we are our physical life." Would you be ready? Could you wait these few weeks? For me, it will be very hard! I will try but I will also fail.

But you know what? It's all good. God's grace is not dependent on our actions. It is a result of the immensity of God's love. We are saved by God's grace, through Jesus Christ. This grace sets us free. Free to go out into the community and be "little Christs". Because of God's grace, we NEVER have to do, we ALWAYS get to do!!

This Advent, be ready to wait. When we wait, it means what we hope for has not yet come. We anticipate what has been promised, we believe it's on its way, but not here yet. We actively look for it, but we wait. While we wait, let's quietly, and boldly, experience the anticipation of God coming in the ordinary events of our lives. I know that God comes to us not once, but over and over.

Please take the time to look up Isaiah 9:2-7. You will recognize it. It's all about hope. Just like history, in today's world there is lots of gloom and distress, but don't see all that is wrong and broken around us. Don't hope we can fix it all. INSTEAD let Advent remind us to put our hope in God. The time will come when there will be happiness, joy, and salvation. In the meantime, wait for the many occasions and opportunities for the "lowly to be lifted up, the hungry fed, and to see God's mercy alive." Grace to you.


