

Thoughts From a Deacon 01/17/2023

I hear voices. Do you? The voices come from

everywhere and I believe we each have a lot of sounds, voices, words that go around in our head that disagree and do not make sense. I wonder where on earth these voices/thoughts come from.

I love the word cacophony. It means a harsh discordant of sounds, "bad sounds." You know, cacophonous sounds harsh, doesn't it. But there's more to it than just good sound/bad sound. It's more about how the sound may or may not match the content of what's around.

The cacophony of voices can prevent me from making decisions. And this din is just inside my own head. What about when I step out into the world? All the people, all the conversations, all the media, all the opinions! Yikes.



We can become filled with anxiety, worry and fear, and include our prayers and scripture into this mix. We begin the day trusting God and confident that we can do this, and God is with us. And then the sounds of life get jumbled, and we rely on our own strength and power to try to get away from the cacophony.

God can help. Surrender to God every part of you. Find the peaceful melody of life with God. Sit with Jesus and allow the Holy Spirit to speak to your heart.

Listen to the voice of the Spirit, not the cacophony within your head and with the rest of the world. Start each day anew and let God guide you through. Focus on God, keep pulling yourself back to the present moment and listen to the peaceful melody of the Spirit within your soul. Allow the Holy Spirit to fill you with strength and courage and peace.

Often God speaks through the voices of angels or messengers or people. Let me recognize His voice, hear His voice and follow Him.

Have you seen The Chosen?






During our upcoming Lent dinners, we will be watching and discussing The Chosen which has been a well received series as it follows Jesus and his disciples.

The Daughters of the King (DOK) is an Order


